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### April 2020

## 1. Disability Accommodation

An overstressed County worker was denied a request to transfer to less stressful work, sued for disability discrimination, and was entitled to a trial because evidence of a neurological impairment would require the County to accommodate his needs.

# 2. Special Needs Trust

A disabled child received a malpractice settlement in a trust allowing her to qualify for Medicaid, but funds unspent at her death were payable to Medicaid as reimbursement for benefits paid.

# 3. Internet Trespass

An employee created a website but registered it to himself and changed jobs. The company won its claim for "trespass to chattel" (interference with its personal property) but lost its claim for unfair competition.

### 4. Amusement Parks

The exterior of an amusement park was sufficiently "public" to allow social protesting as a right of free expression.

#### 5. Broken Sidewalk

A man tripped over a sidewalk edge lifted by 1.2 inches and sued the City for a dangerous condition, but the defect was deemed "trivial" and the City won.

#### 6. Rental Cars

Customers sued an agency for excessive optional insurance costs, but lost, because the premiums did not need to be exactly what the agency paid for a discounted master policy.

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# 7. <u>Hostile Environment</u>

- a) A worker sued her employer for allowing intolerable working conditions which caused her to quit. She won the right to a trial where she might prove she was "constructively discharged".
- b) Another employee sued the same company for a similar reason, and also won, because disrupting a worker's "emotional tranquility" also constitutes an unlawful hostile environment.

## 8. Gas Leak

A delay of a utility in announcing a major gas leak could be considered in determining if criminal negligence had occurred.

## 9. Current Cases
